- Toilets are located on Level 0. Accessible toilets are located on Levels 0.1.2.3. Changing Places toilet is located on Level 0.





First World War Galleries

Discover the story of the First World War through the eves of the British people and the Empire, both on the home front and the fighting fronts. On display are objects from IWM's collections including weapons. uniforms, diaries, keepsakes, film and art.

Second World War Galleries

Across the globe millions of people from the United States to Europe, Asia, and Africa were affected by the devastating events of the Second World War.
