## Social distancing at the bus stop:


To allow for social distancing buses will have limited capacity. If your bus has a BUS FULL sign please be prepared to wait for the next bus.

Please be kind and look out for other passengers who might need to travel more urgently than you.

Take note and follow any posters at your bus stop which offer guidance of how to travel safely.

At bus stops, try to keep 2 metres away from anyone else in the queue.

Let people off the bus before you get on and try to keep a safe distance between you, the driver and other customers.

## **Social distancing on the bus:**

Sit in the window seat, leaving the seats in front and behind you empty and don't sit directly behind the driver.

Only one person can sit in a double seat, unless you're with a member of your household.

Don't stand on the bus.

Once you're on the bus open a window, if you can, to help with ventilation.

The Government has announced that wearing a face covering will be mandatory when using public transport from 15 June.

When leaving the bus stay seated until the bus stops and take everything with you.
