Lorag Leader here. Received and understood.

Yes, this is G Sector.....right. Thank you. Sir, the Observer Corps are reporting 3 large formations of enemy aircraft approaching Sevenoaks and

Maidstone on a 30 mile-wide front. Estimates 150 to 200 bombers, 400 fighters. Likely target London.

Thank you, Ops. Dorey Control to Lorag Leader. There's some trade heading northwest to the south of you. 500 plus bandits at Angels 2-1, over.
