



Explore IWM London

1 hour

- Take in the spectacular display in the atrium, featuring an array of objects that bear witness to the force, fury and physicality of war.
- Grab a drink in the café on Level 0 and visit our book shop on Level 1, and the two gift shops on Levels 0 and 1.
- Visit one of our special exhibitions on Level 3. Ask at the Information Desk on Level 0 to find out more about what's on.

2 hours +

- Concentrate on a particular time period. Use this map to discover our permanent galleries.
- Join one of our knowledgeable guides for a tour of one of our galleries, where you will discover extraordinary stories of ordinary people in times of conflict. Ask for details at the Information Desk.










